Decision made:	Award a consultancy agreement contract to Six Property Consulting Limited for the provision of Professional Consultancy Services to manage delivery of Herefordshire Council's school building capital works programme 2023/24, 2024/25 and 2025/26, following a competitive procurement exercise in accordance with the Council's procurement rules and procedures.
	Planned works and unplanned capital works are included in the

programme. The service will be based on the projected three-year planned and unplanned maintenance programme which runs from 01 April 2023 to 31 March 2026, excluding any defect liability periods.

The contract has been agreed on a percentage fee basis, including a hourly rate for any work requested which cannot be valued using the percentage fee, based on the proposed programme provided in the tender opportunity estimated at £3,570,000. The programme is subject to change as works can be omitted or added to the programme following investigations, therefore fees could vary on delivery of the programme.

Responsibility for monitoring the programme to be carried out by the Capital Senior Project Manager within the spend budget.

## Reasons for decision:

Appointment of a consultant is required to assist with the delivery of the 2023-2026 programme of works following completion of the recent condition surveys.

To deliver beneficial improvements in the condition of the Council's Educational building stock, improving the educational experience for pupils within the buildings.

To reduce ongoing building maintenance costs by addressing known defects with high maintenance cost potential and preventing further deterioration.

To ensure all Council buildings are fit for purpose and maintained to the standards as set out in the condition survey to address suitability, sustainability and affordability.

## **Equality Considerations**

Under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010, the 'general duty' on public authorities is set out as follows: A public authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to –

The proposed capital maintenance schemes have given due consideration to equality issues particularly in relation to disability. The council maintains an accessibility strategy.

Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/ equality considerations:	The budget costs for the planned works are estimates and subject to change as the scope of each scheme is refined and as the actual costs become known. Monitoring of the budget will be carried out by the Capital Senior Project Manager.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	Do nothing. This is not recommended as the risk of planned works and unplanned reactive works not being completed means that the health and safety risk associated with the continued existence of the building remains.
	Not to appoint. This is not recommended. Six Property Consulting Limited have been selected through a competitive tendering process. By not appointing would mean the Council would lack the technical support necessary to successfully deliver the school capital programme.
