Cllr Bramer (Community Services and Assets) has been briefed on the capital programme on Tuesday 6 th June and the February 2023 Cabinet Report has been shared.
Decision made:	To award CF Roberts the contract for the Boiler Programme works various primary schools in Herefordshire, following a successful tender via Herefordshire Council's procurement portal.
	To approve the expenditure of up to £300,000.00 for works, which includes a contingency of up to £27,980.00
	To approve the expenditure of up to £33,000 for professional fees.
	Responsibility for monitoring the programme to be carried out by the Capital Senior Project Manager within the spend budget.
Reasons for decision:	The Boiler Programme works at various primary schools in Herefordshire are planned works included in the 2021-2023 Schools Capital Maintenance Programme, which have carried forward into the 2023-2026 Programme for delivery.
	To deliver beneficial improvements in the condition of the Council's Educational building stock, improving the educational experience for

	pupils within the buildings.
	To reduce ongoing building maintenance costs by addressing known defects with high maintenance cost potential and preventing further deterioration.
	To ensure all Council buildings are fit for purpose and maintained to the standards set out in the condition survey to address suitability, sustainability and affordability.

	A contingency has been allowed to cover unforeseen elements once the Boiler Programme works commence. Should this contingency be insufficient then a further officer decision will be required.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	Do nothing. This is not recommended as the risk of these works not being completed means that the health and safety risk associated with the continued existence of the building remains.
