	Decision: That:
	a) £250k of the approved £500k, but un-committed, reconfiguration and improvement budget for the Ryefield Centre estate capital programme 2020/21 is reallocated to complete Plough Lane Council offices building infrastructure changes;
	b) the Director of Resources and Assurance be authorised to take all operational decisions necessary to implement the above recommendations within the approved budget.

Consultation:	No external consultation.
Decision made:	To direct award a contract via the Under Essex Procurement Hub framework EPHF001_Webcasting to VP-AV Limited to complete installation of audio visual conferencing equipment within Committee Room 1, Plough Lane Offices, Hereford, and to provide annual maintenance and support for a four year term, at a cost of up to £185,462.50, inclusive of annual costs.
Reasons for decision:	Herefordshire Council has a dedicated committee meeting room (Committee Room 1) for use by officers to run both public and internal meetings. This assigned room currently has four TV screens and a camera which staff can connect to their laptops to run the meetings. Herefordshire Council requires a solution which will provide in room audio enhancement through delegate microphones, enable hybrid meetings to be run, with some presenters in the room and some attending remotely, and allow meetings to be recorded and live streamed to the public without the need for external third parties.

	Room layout will not be supported by the audio visual solution proposed. Mitigation: Democratic Services will work closely with the supplier to ensure a solution to accommodate a number of meeting layouts.
Details of any alternative options	Briefly summarise any alternative options and say why they were rejected.
considered and rejected:	 To not utilise committee conferencing equipment. This was not recommended on the basis that Herefordshire Council holds both physical and hybrid meetings. To hold hybrid meetings requires committee conferencing apparatus. Further, committee conferencing equipment enables the council lead in example by creating highly accessible public committees. For example, via online streaming, recordings and through established internet media this gives the council a global reach To stay with the current system. This is not recommended. Democratic services routinely receive feedback from members and members of the public that the broadcast quality using the existing camera and microphone system is poor. Often, to the point where the spoken voice is inaudible and the quality of the video is of poor quality.
