Reasons for decision:	The hub has been in place since 2021 and provides eight units of
neasons for decision.	emergency accommodation and four self-contained flats for vulnerable
	homeless people. Support and advice to occupants is provided by the
	council's Housing Solutions service with housing management through Citizen Housing.
	This accommodation makes a substantial contribution to ensuring effective pathways are in place for vulnerable homeless people to move towards living independently in long term homes. The hub helps reduce rough sleeping and supports the Homelessness Prevention Strategy for Herefordshire.
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	The nominations and operational agreement between the two organisations (Herefordshire Council and Citizen Housing) supports the
	effective delivery of accommodation and support of homeless people at
	the hub. In addition to detailing how people living on-site are contacted
	and supported and the use of space, the agreement serves to promote
	transparency and good outcomes for homeless people.
	The agreement will be in place for the period 11 th July 2024 to 31 st March 2027 with robust options for review and termination, within the term of
	the agreement.

	Lack of demand is considered low risk. The current levels of demand are

	well understood by operational teams and are sufficient to be managed in part through the premises, the nomination and operating agreement will provide for regular reviews of need and demand, and can be terminated with notice.
	There is no detrimental impact for any group with a protected characteristic anticipated from this decision, as it leads to an increase in facilities and an improved service for a vulnerable group of local people.

	No other premises are available which offers extensive accommodation appropriately configured for a hub, with space for multi-agency working and support to be provided on site.
	Loss of 12 units of accommodation would be detrimental to the council's ability to improve outcomes for very vulnerable people and provide opportunities to further reduce homelessness in Herefordshire.
