I moved here full-well knowing that the pub will be renovated and I am prepared for the inevitable noise that will increase but it is bearable knowing that people will be leaving at normal time so at least I can go to sleep from just after 11pm but 1am is absolutely unbelievable. Signs up to make people aware of locals living close by, will not stop people, who have been drinking for two extra hours, from being a nuisance.</p> <p>Not only will this proposal cause distress to my family but others in the neighbourhood. This is a conservation area and will disturb the peace and quiet of the surrounding area; surely there are strict rules against late night opening? There is a glamping site close by and they abide by the rules of keeping quiet after</p>

10pm. There is a horse stables so this will disturb and upset the horses.
Furthermore, people staying in the pub will also want quiet once the pub is closed at normal time too? The shop owners work tirelessly from 7am to 8pm and they need their sleep as well as being neighbours themselves.

I have researched pubs in the area and all of their opening times are at the normal time of 11pm. 1am is resigned to those that are in inner city areas where there are clubs for youngsters to enjoy rather than disrupt young families and older people who have moved to have a quieter life than being in a city.

In addition, the proposed New Year's Eve extra extension is quite frankly ridiculous and regardless of whether this is a 'special' night or not, my family and the rest of the community should not suffer just for the sake of a few people who want to have a good time. I am really disappointed in the fact that the Savidges' promised us a family-centred pub at the meeting at the village hall several months ago.

To Protect Children from Harm

I live directly behind the pub [REDACTED]. There is going to be a significant noise increase with people/cars coming and going late into the night as well as being out in the garden area which is in an open area adjacent to my garden where the noise will easily travel, especially in the summer months. My children are going to be woken up and upset by the lack of sleep that they will be getting, even at the weekend, which will have an impact on their schoolwork as concentration levels will be affected. They

need unbroken sleep; there are enough issues with cars racing with loud exhausts up and down the street. [REDACTED] already suffers from anxiety and this noise will inevitably cause this to increase; sleep deprivation, I have seen from research, can then have untold damage later in their lives.
