

Launching the new Herefordshire RE Agreed Syllabus Thursday 10th July 2025

Venue: The Bishop of Hereford's Bluecoat School, Hereford, HRI IUU

The 2020—2025 Herefordshire syllabus is updated and upgraded for 2025—2030. The revision takes account of national developments in RE since 2020, including the RE Council's religion and worldviews approach, Ofsted's three types of knowledge, including 'ways of knowing', and demographic changes. Additional units give more focus on non-religious worldviews, multidisciplinary RE, anti-racism and care for the Earth. The new syllabus will be a **statutory requirement for all maintained schools** without a religious character and it is recommended for all academies.

Programme

9.15 Welcome and introduction

9.20-10.40 Session 1: Introducing the revised syllabus

Exploring the key features of the revisions to the agreed syllabus; what stays the same, what is new, and why. Focus on classroom ideas to put into action, and an introduction to a religion and worldviews approach.

11.00-12.30 Session 2: Applying 'ways of knowing' in RE: practical strategies

Sharing some active ideas to put the syllabus revisions into practice, responding to current moves in RE towards a religion and worldviews approach, and to Ofsted's description of 'ways of knowing'.

1.20-2.40 Session 3: Long-term planning; engaging pupils' personal worldviews

Practical guidance on constructing coherent long-term plans and takeaway ideas for embedding learning. This session also explores the complexity of pupils' worldviews and practical ways of exploring non-religiousness in the classroom.

2.40-2.45 Thanks and evaluations
