Key considerations

- 2. Herefordshire Council's All Age Carers Strategy was approved by Cabinet on 28 July 2024. At the Cabinet meeting, the chairs of the Health, Care and Wellbeing Scrutiny Committee and Children and Young People Scrutiny Committee agreed to meet to discuss scrutiny of the strategy's supporting actions. At their subsequent meeting, it was agreed that scrutiny of the supporting action plan would be undertaken by the Health, Care and Wellbeing Scrutiny Committee.
- 3. The Health, Care and Wellbeing Scrutiny Committee agreed that due to the detailed nature of their proposed work, they would carry it out informally through a working group of the committee. The terms of reference for the group are attached as Appendix 1 to this report. The committee met on 10 April with the chair of the All-Age Carers' Partnership, working through the action-plan to identify opportunities to contribute to its development.
- 4. The working group's findings and suggestions are attached as Appendix 2 to this report. The committee agreed that it would make no formal recommendations following this work. Instead, the working group made a number of suggestions to attending officers, who will incorporate these into the strategy's action plan. These suggestions are contained in Appendix 2.
