Executive Response	Agreed. The Council will in the first instance identify the existing percentage of canopy coverage upon its own estate. Once undertaken it will be necessary to establish the land available for tree planting – as certain land such as Highway is likely to be constrained.  From this figure a proportionate target can be established, quantifying the number of trees this would approximately equate to. In this instance it may be more appropriate to quantify number of trees given that Ash Die Back is necessitating removal and reinstatement of new planting the percentage of canopy coverage may show a deficit in the early years.
