Members of the Licensing Panel of the Council's Regulatory Committee considered the above application, full details of which appeared before the Members in their agenda and the background papers.

Prior to making their decision, the Members heard from Mr. Kirby, the Applicant, as well as Mrs. Robinson and Mrs. Brooks, two of the local residents who had raised objections to the application.

Having carefully considered those matters brought before them, the Committee were of the opinion that the application should be **granted subject** to the conditions appearing below. In reaching their decision, the Members had full regard to both the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's Licensing Policy. The Members imposed conditions in order to promote the four licensing objectives, namely the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

CONDITIONS

The application was granted in respect of the hours of operation of the licensable activities described in the box above together with the following conditions

• The mandatory conditions of The Licensing Act 2003.

PUBLIC NUISANCE

- Any recorded music provided at the premises shall be maintained at background level only.
- Live music shall be provided at the premises on Saturday evenings only between 20.30 and 23.30 hours.
- Prominent notices shall be displayed at the exits to the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- The licensee shall ensure that noise and vibration does not emanate from the premises so as to cause a public nuisance.
- All external windows and doors shall be closed when live music is provided at the premises.

PUBLIC SAFETY

- No open containers to be removed from the premises.
- A current inspection certificate shall be held for all electrical installations in accordance with BS 7671 and BS5266-1.
- All parts of the premises shall be provided with adequate illumination during the whole time the premises are being used for any licensable activities. All routes of escape and all parts of the premises to which the public have access shall be provided with adequate and assured lighting from independent supplies and systems.
- Adequate means of ventilation shall be provided at the premises whilst open to the public.

ADDITIONAL CONDITION

• SIA registered door steward to be in place between the hours of 2000 – 2400 hours on any Saturday when live music takes place.
